Heaven

We all wonder about Heaven. What is it like? We can imagine it this way or that, we can search Scriptures to gain a better idea. But our imaginations come short of the glory there and Scripture offers a surprisingly small amount of detail about our future home. We do, however, the witness of some Bible characters who got glimpses of Heaven.

Isaiah appears to be in Heaven when he sees God seated on a throne (Isaiah 6). Stephen was given a glimpse of Heaven just before he was martyred for his faith (Acts 7:55-6). The Apostle Paul was brought into Heaven as he describes in II Corinthians 12:2. These

glimpses took place at special moments in the lives of these men. Not much detail about Heaven is revealed in the passages mentioned, except to say that God is in Heaven and Heaven is a marvelous place.

John tells us the most important fact about Heaven—God is there! "God's presence is with people, and he will live with them and they will be his people. God himself will be with them and be their God." (Revelation 21:3). In heaven, believers will enjoy the presence of God, an experience that has not been fully available to humanity since the fall in the Garden (Genesis 3).

In the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve had a perfect relationship with God. Ezekiel called it the "garden of God" (Ezekiel 28:13). That all came to an end when they sinned. They were driven out of the Garden and God placed an angel there with a flaming sword in all directions east of the garden (Genesis 3:24). Anyone who wished to return to the garden had to face the judgment of the sword.

We, as God's people, despite the fact Eden is no longer is accessible, can still experience this same closeness with him on earth, though only a fraction of the original closeness. As Christians we can confidently proclaim, "God is with us!" Christ's incarnation, sinless life, and subsequent death on the cross makes that possible for us. John wrote, "No one has ever seen God. But God the only Son...has shown us what God is like." (John 1:18). Jesus Christ is the ultimate form of God's presence with humanity on earth.

Here and now, we get only small glimpses of Heaven, but praise God, through his Son Jesus Christ, we can all experience it fully some day.

May God bless us as we trust Him endeavor to serve Him daily---Jeff
