Heart to Heart

I often say as we close worship, "The altar is always open." Those words are true and heartfelt. I observe that we sometimes carry around burdens unnecessarily. There is no magic place to kneel in prayer and not magic words to include in our prayers. Prayer and confession are spiritual matters, not logistical exercises or choreographed exercises. The writer of Hebrews encourages us by telling us to take care that our hearts are right and even calls us "partners of Christ."

"12 Take care, brothers and sisters, that none of you may have an evil, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God. 13 But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," so that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. 14 For we have become partners of Christ, if only we hold our first confidence firm to the end." —Hebrews 3.12-14

Last week, Jaclyn, in one of her wonderful children's moments, talked about looking like a Christian. We are often challenged to examine ourselves in comparing our walk to our professions of discipleship. I would suggest there exists a problem within a person who professes to be a Christian but never feels spiritual conviction or the need for self-examination. None of us is perfect in our walk. There is no shame in praying for forgiveness, even in front of people.

God wants to hear from us, heart to heart. He calls us to examine ourselves and confess where we fail.

The writer of Hebrews warns against having evil, unbelieving hearts, placing the conditional phrase, "if only we hold our first confidence firm to the end." IN other words, the message is for us to live out the faith we claim to possess.

My great aunt Ella used to say to people who were living contrary to what they claimed as faith, "You are doing so loud that I can't hear what you are saying." That is the same thing Jaclyn told the children and the writer or Hebrews tells us.
