All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

Blessed be the holy Trinity, \oplus one God, who forgives all our sin, whose mercy endures forever.

Let us confess our sin and come to God for healing. *Silence is kept for reflection.*

Gracious God,

have mercy on us.

We confess that we have honored you with our lips, but have harmed our neighbors with our tongues.

The cravings at war within us cause conflicts and disputes.

In our desire to be first

we make distinctions among ourselves.

We place the needs of the poor and the suffering last.

In your great mercy, forgive us our sins.

Draw near to us with grace in time of need, and turn us to follow in the way of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

The reading concludes: The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**



COMMUNITY MEANING-MAKING


During our conversation, we follow these Touchstones for Safe Places:


- Choose for yourself when and how to participate.

*LORD'S PRAYER


Our Father, who art in heaven,

When giving the bread and cup, those serving say The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. and each person may respond Amen.

The minister communes after others receive communion.

After the post-communion blessing and prayer, dessert is served, then all assist in cleanup, and re-gather for sending.
