

Pastor's Desk

What a wonderful summer we are having the weather is warmer and more of our summer parishioners can be with us in our celebration of the Eucharist.

The American physician and writer Ira Byock claimed that years ago Margaret Mead was asked by a Student what she considered to be the first sign of civilization in a culture.

"The student expected Mead to talk about fishhooks or clay pots or grinding stones. But no. Mead said that the first sign of civilization in an ancient culture was a femur [thighbone] that had been broken and then healed.

Mead explained that in the animal kingdom, if you break your leg, you died. You cannot run from danger, get to the river for a drink or hunt for food. You are meat for prowling beasts. No animal survives a broken leg long enough for the bone to heal. A broken femur that has healed is evidence that someone has taken time to stay with the one who fell, has bound up the wound, had carried the person to safety and has tended the person through recovery. Helping someone else through difficulty is where civilizations stars, Mead said."

Dr. Byock concludes: "We are at our best when we serve others. Be civilized" The Best Care Possible.

These are good words for us to ponder, and this is a part of cultural history that needs more reflection. The moment in time highlighted by Mead represents a departure from the animal world and the beginning of human empathy. This awakening, Mead says, was the birth of civilization. What a tremendous insight on the part of this incredible mind!

She sees the heart of civil behavior as one human being feeling empathy for another. It may have been a confusing moment for all those involved. Where did that emotion come from?

This is the very point of our human story that interests Jesus the most because it is in our empathy that we reflect the goodness of our created being most genuinely. It is how the one who sent Jesus means for us to act: with deep love for one another that puts others needs before our own. In Mead's scenario, they had to put their own interests on hold while they tended to their wounded tribe member.

They could not hunt or gather as long as they were making sure that the broken bone was mending. This could be the kind of distinction Paul makes in his letter to the Ephesians when he says, "The days are evil. Therefore....be filled with the Spirit."

He begs them and urges them to "[address] one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks always and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father. This is what Jesus envisions when he shares with them the bread of life. He is sharing himself: the way he lives, the way he makes sacrifices for them, the way he refuses to back away from his message even when it threatens his very life. His way is the most genuine way of living.

In this Eucharist, may we find that same courage and strength----to make the life of Jesus our very own model.
