Pastor's Desk

In today's Gospel Lesson, Jesus comes into a village and is received into the home of two friends: a woman named Mary and her sister, Martha. Although Luke condenses the episode into just a few short verses, the scenario is one with which most of us can readily identify. Mary focuses her attention on the guest. She sits "at the Lord's feet," listening "to His teaching." She opens her heart and mind to what Jesus is saying to her. She opens her heart and mind to the possibility of Jesus bringing something new and beautiful into her life. In Jesus' words, "Mary has chosen the good portion, which shall not be taken away from her" (Lk.10:42). Martha, on the other hand, is motivated by anxiety. She is preoccupied with the trappings of hospitality. She is worried about making a good impression as a hostess. She is "distracted with much serving," Luke says.

Everything must be just right. (Sound familiar?) Moreover, Martha is disturbed because Mary isn't anxious and tense. She even tries to get Jesus to worry about it. "Lord," she asks, "are you not concerned that my sister has left me to do all the household tasks alone?" (Lk.10:40). Jesus replies, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things; one thing is needful" (Lk. 10:42). For Martha, for Mary, for you, and me, it is a matter of putting first things first -- a matter of priorities.

What is happening here is not that Jesus is being contemptuous of the household tasks involved in preparing a meal for an honored guest. Instead, Martha's focus has shifted, and she is confusing means with ends. At first, the important thing is to serve Jesus and give Him a proper reception. But then Martha's emphasis is away from Jesus, and it focuses on the project itself. If her task is to succeed, Mary must help. And even Jesus must help by using His authority to get Mary to help. Martha is no longer serving the Lord. Her primary concern is that she will succeed in being a super hostess. Martha has not chosen the "good portion."

When I come into the pulpit, if my primary goal is to try to deliver a perfect sermon rather than to serve the Lord, I have not chosen the good portion.

When you come into Church, if your primary goal is to be perfectly pious rather than serve the Lord, you have not chosen the good portion. In your relationships with one another, if your primary goals are to succeed in controlling and dominating and manipulating, rather than to serve the Lord, you have not chosen the good portion.

Once, the famous playwright Arthur Miller was asked to describe the difference between an ordinary play and a great drama. "In any successful play," Miller said, "there must be something which makes the audience say to themselves, 'Good Lord, that's me!" That is precisely what Jesus' words are evoking from us constantly. He says,

"You pay tithes, while neglecting justice and the love of God" (Lk. 11:42).

Good Lord, that's me!

"You lay impossible burdens on men, but will not lift a finger to lighten them (Lk. 11:46).

"Mary sat at the table at the Lord's feet and listened to His teaching." Like Mary, we must listen to Him! Make whatever adjustment in your life may be necessary to allow the voice of forgiveness, compassion, and love to penetrate your soul!

Listen to Him! Resist every temptation to return to the old sounds of vengeance, retribution, and hate.

Listen to Him! Resist every temptation to acquire money and things at the expense of honesty and decency in human relationships.

Listen to Him! But be prepared! The more you listen to Him, the closer you will get to Him. The more you listen to Him, the closer you get to one another. And that's the real miracle!

That's when you will hear Jesus' words, "She has chosen the good portion ... He has chosen the good portion." And then your response can be, "Good Lord, that's me!"

First Reading: Genesis 18:1-10a

- 2. Was God present in the guests? Abraham begat Isaac as a reward for his hospitality. Who needs your hospitality today? If you show hospitality to immigrants or the unhoused, you probably won't get an "Isaac," but what kind of reward might you experience?

Second Reading: Colossians 1:24-28
