

Grace and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

In our noisy world, is there any room for quiet? In our practical, scientific world, is there any room for mystery and wonder? It is interesting that scientists, even in the top of their fields, seem to find plenty to wonder about both in the universe and in human behavior.

I think about Joseph and Mary and wonder how different our world would have been if they both decided not to follow the call to be the earthly parents of Jesus. We can speak about human behavior; we can rationalize what we would do or how we would respond but that is just speculation, and we will never be tested like Joseph and Mary.

It would be foolish to wonder what God had in mind for the people of creation. No one can fathom the depths of God's full intent for us. However, God saw that once we lost our way in the Garden of Eden, He needed to provide a way out of darkness and restore our relationship with Him. Today the people of God have a choice to live in the light of Christ or remain in darkness and chaos.

Joseph and Mary saw that they would have to make the choice early on. The shepherds had a choice to go and see what had been told to them. The Magi had a choice and came because they saw His star announcing the birth of the King. Now, we must separate light from darkness in the relationship and knowledge of being God's people. God provided a way to know the light and a way to live with him. Advent is a time for seeking God's guidance and responding to the love He showered upon His creation. I hope that you will engage with the church as we respond to God's call. We gather for the celebration of Jesus' birth by choice because of "Love".

#### Treasurer's Report: Ken Busarow

Epiphany Lutheran Church Treasurer Period Ending 10/31/2023


Overall, we're still experiencing losses in the general fund month over month. The losses are a product of giving under-running budget predictions. Expenditure continues to under-run as well which is helping to offset the losses. With two months remaining, it's anticipated giving will increase, which is typical from Thanksgiving through the Christmas season curtailing any additional losses.

The 2024 General Budget is now in place. Weekly giving to meet the 2024 budget needs to average \$7,087.00, which is a 5 percent increase over the 2023 actual weekly giving average of \$6,750.00. Notable changes to the 2024 budget are the addition of a part time Youth Director, funding for the development of the Youth Mission Journey program, seed funding for community outreach with the Farmer's Market at Ashland and two Summer Youth Camps, one for music/drama and one for math/science.

# MEET YOUR COUNCIL

**Property Liaison: Rod Dwyer** 



Dr. Rod Dwyer has the privilege of serving the Council as liaison to the social ministries committee, which is chaired by his wife, Deacon Carole.

He received his medical training at the University of Michigan and his postgraduate studies at Mid-Michigan Medical Center, Midland Michigan, and Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit. During his surgery residency he was drafted and served in the United States Army Medical Corps serving as surgical staff at 18th Surgical Hospital in Vietnam.

He completed his formal training and became co-founder of the Southern Colorado Clinic, a multi-specialty medical clinic in Pueblo, Colorado. He is certified by the American Board of Surgery and elected as a Fellow, American College of Surgeons. He served as President, Pueblo County Medical Society, and a term as President of the Colorado Chapter of the American College of Surgeons. In 1984 he left his private practice for active service in the United States Navy, serving over 22 years. He was Department Chair and Director, Surgical Services for two Naval Hospitals, Pensacola and Okinawa, Japan, Officer in Charge for two Surgical Teams deployed at sea and ashore in the Middle East, numerous assignments as Ship's Surgeon in Aircraft Carriers and Amphibious Assault ships. He participated as Officer in charge, Medical Detachment USS IWO Jima, in US Marine Corps combat operations for *Desert Shield / Desert Storm*, and as Senior Medical staff for Fleet Hospital Three for *Operation Iraqi Freedom* in the Iraqi Desert., caring for US military, POWs, and injured and sick Iraqi civilians and children.

Rod and Carole are blessed with 8 children, 7 grandchildren and 6 great grandchildren.


