PASTOR'S CORNER



What is Lent? "Lent is derived from the Middle English "Lente" which means springtime."

Lent is a 40 day period of repentance and renewal that precedes Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on the day we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord. Holy Week commemorates Christ's last week of life on the earth. It's the final and the most important part of Lent.

Over the past few weeks, you've heard me speak about repentance, reconciliation, self-examination and having a heart filled with Christ. We've listened and learned that setting aside time for self-examination provides spiritual health and growth as we reflect on what is important in our lives. Spiritual renewal is possible only if you're willing to repent for sins known and unknown. I encouraged each member of Epiphany to take home and put into practice the section in the bulletin titled "Confession and Forgiveness". Christian maturity begins when you acknowledge dependence on God. As followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves daily to the struggle against sin but we know that God has provided an escape route for us. Jesus is the way and the truth and the life. Those who believe in him will have eternal life.

When you have the certainty of faith that God loves you and forgives your sins because of Christ's death on the cross, you are justified. The enormous debt of sin; even the sin that is waging war in you now, is paid in full by Jesus. By faith, God counts that payment as being made by you. "Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen."

I'd like to encourage all of you to commit yourselves to growing in Christ, growing in faith, growing in the renewal of the Spirit by attending the services of Holy Week.

Attend your church services for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and arrive renewed on Resurrection Sunday. Experience the gift of Holy Week and "feel" not just "attend" how Jesus' love for you transforms the celebration of the resurrection.

<u>Pull Tab Collections</u> – Barb delivered 4100 pull tabs to the Ronald McDonald House on Sunday, March 6, 2022. The Ronald McDonald House uses the money from the tabs to pay their utilities.

<u>New Member Sunday</u> – Epiphany Lutheran Church **donated \$50 to the NALC Great Commissio**n for our new members that joined on February 27, 2022.

<u>Donation of the Lenten coin offerings</u> – Regina spoke with Joyce at Camp Happy Sands. They are excited to be back open this year, but only for 4 weeks in June. The Social Ministry Committee chose **June 14, 2022 as Epiphany Lutheran Church's volunteer day. We will be delivering lunch to the camp on that day as well as beach towels, school supplies and back packs.** More to come on accepting donations. We will also be applying for a Thrivent grant to purchase the food, so we can **also donate half the Lenten offerings to a local center for kids with Autism and mental illness. More to come on the exact center.**

A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER

Qualified Charitable Distributions from your IRA

Have you recently finished filing your income taxes? Were you able to claim Itemized Deductions or did you Claim the Standard Deduction? When the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act was implemented a few years back, it greatly increased the Standard Deduction, meaning that most people will no longer benefit from itemized deductions. Itemized deductions include medical expenses (over a certain threshold), real estate taxes paid (up to a limit), mortgage interest paid, and charitable contributions. If you are now claiming a Standard Deduction, you are no longer benefiting (for income tax purposes only) from your charitable contributions... but what if there was a way that you could?

Do you have an IRA that you are taking "Required Minimum Distributions" from? If yes, you could receive a tax benefit for making "Qualified Charitable Distributions", or QCDs. A QCD is where you tell the custodian of your IRA to send a portion of your RMD to a qualified public charity. The custodian sends this amount directly to the charity and you can exclude that amount from your taxable IRA distributions on your tax return for the year. This only works for IRA distributions – not pensions, not 401(k) plans. Your IRA custodian should have paperwork for you to complete should you choose to make QCDs. If you have general questions, Vanessa is happy to talk to you (after tax filing season is over).
