Halloween costumes and decorations appearing, pumpkins and apple cider, and pumpkin flavored everything are signs of October around us. In the church, the first Sunday of October is World Communion Sunday. We remember that it isn't just the people we know in this church gathering for communion, it is Christians of many countries and cultures all gathering for communion as a celebration of our connections in the Body of Christ.



We will also have a celebration of baptism in October, and the third graders will receive their Bibles! We welcome all ages in church, and we have expanded our Sunday school this fall to also include a class for 5th through 8th graders, and we are hoping to add a nursery and toddler room! In September Dee and I began leading a combination Confirmation Class and Middle School Youth Group for 6th through 8th graders. So we are adding more options for how all ages can grow in Christ.

But we don't stop growing as adults! For adults, Pastor Jill Mack leads a Bible study on Monday evenings at 5:30, and our adult Wesley Class, led by Phil Kakacek, meets on Sunday mornings at 10:20 in the lower level of the Family Life Center. We also offer other short term opportunities for study two or three times a year, and a short class series for those who wish to learn more about the United Methodist Church, following Jesus, and membership in this congregation.

Our worship in October will have the theme "Growth as Growing in Christ," which will also include our Stewardship Campaign. We will take the opportunity to celebrate the mission and ministry we are already doing, how those things are growing, and we will invite each other to make our financial and volunteer commitments to the mission and ministry we will be doing together as a church in 2025.

The theme scripture is Ephesians 4:15-16, "Speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love." We will hear testimonies from people in our congregation who have been nurtured by this part of the Body of Christ here in Solon, learn how they have grown in faith, and how they have grown in how they live out their faith in the world.

May we find new ways to encourage each other to grow in faith, and to be active disciples of Jesus Christ in the world!

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Greetings my brothers and sisters in Christ,

Here at church we have had a wonderful start to our school year. For those of you with students in school, I pray that you had a great start as well. It has been wonderful seeing all these young faces in church. As you know we now have two Sunday school classrooms and three youth groups. That shows how our church is supporting our students. Please be prayerful of the growing needs of our children's education program. We are exploring the possibility of adding a 3rd classroom/nursery to accommodate the needs of our families that have children three years of age and under! Just a reminder, our students will sing the first Sunday of every month. Come and hear our children sing during the children's message!

Our Pre-k through 4th grade class is learning all about Noah and how he followed God's instructions to save the animals and the people from the great flood! They have created rainbows out of yarn, a rainbow template, and cotton balls. During their second class they made an ark out of tasty snacks and animal crackers! Both classrooms are enjoying singing "Rise and Shine" (better known as the Noah's ark song) and the "Rainbow Song".

Our 5th grade-8th grade classroom is using the Bible to find answers to some tough questions they may have in their lives right now. The first Sunday they learned was about doubting God and how some people in the Bible doubted God as well. We talked about how to use the Bible, the church, and our friends to get us through some hard times. The class also learned about forgiveness. We discussed what the Bible said about forgiveness, how important it is to forgive someone, and how God forgives us as well. Our class has a special bulletin board downstairs that each week will have a new focus word and a scripture that will tie into the lesson for that week. They also get a mystery mission to take home with them to reinforce what they learned that week. Please reach out to these wonderful students about their bulletin board or their mystery missions! They have great insight on the lessons they are learning.

I want to thank everyone who has volunteered so far to help grow our program including our high schoolers that are stepping up to the plate. They have agreed to be our teacher's assistants in the younger classroom. We still need volunteers to help with our growing Sunday school program. Please contact me if you want to volunteer and help our young students on their journey as they learn more about God's love.

Our 3rd graders will be getting their Bibles on October 20th! If you know of any third graders please let either Pastor Peggy or myself know so we can order the Bibles. We will be holding a pizza party for the 3rd graders and their families. After lunch we will have fun activities so they can learn how to use their Bibles.

Our Treasure Seekers group started on September 11th! They are learning about how God created the earth through games, snacks, and activities. Our group is small this year. If you know of a student who is in kindergarten through 5th grade and would like to join or even try out this fun group, please contact me.

We have eight students attending our middle school youth group/confirmation class. They will be learning more about their faith journey, Christianity, and the Methodist church. Our students will have field trips to other faith communities, mission projects and fun activities throughout the school year. Each student will be assigned a mentor to help them through this journey. If you wish to be a mentor please contact either Pastor Peggy or myself.

As I reflect on the past couple of weeks, I see God working in so many different ways. I see families worshiping together, hearing children's voices during the Children's sermon, and volunteers saying we want to help our

children in their faith's journey. May we continue to see how God is working in the education program as it continues to grow.

SUMC RENTALS UPDATE

There are some updates on rentals here at SUMC! The Trustees and Council have updated rental policies to allow rentals of the Fellowship Hall to church members, active constituents and non-profit groups at no charge! Rental Requests will still need to be made via our form, which can be accessed HERE. Requests will need to be approved and added to the church calendar by the office administrator.

Family Life Center Rental rates are now \$40 per hour for sports rentals. The one time event fee for up to 3 hours of gym time for a reception or birthday party are \$50. Church members, and active constituents may receive a discounted rate at 50% of the normal fee for one time use rentals. Discounts will not be given for sports rentals. As is for Fellowship Hall rentals, FLC rentals must be requested by form to the Office Administrator during normal business hours, please plan accordingly. To submit your request via email, send to soloniaumc@gmail.com. All other requests may be done in person on Monday, Tuesday or Thursday between the hours of 8:00 AM and Noon.

If using Fellowship Hall...

- -trash must be taken out following your event
- -chairs and table must be put back as you found them
- -all areas need to be wiped down and swept
- -keys will only be given if event is outside of our normal hours

If using the Family Life Center

- -a key deposit of \$50 is required for ALL
- -lights need to be turned off following your event
- -doors need to be locked at the end of your rental
- -any tables or chairs used need to be put back in their respective areas

United Methodist General Board of Church and Society Condemns the Flagrant Lies and Hate Perpetrated Against Haitian Migrants

General Board of Church and Society September 16, 2024

(Excerpted statement)

Former President Donald J. Trump and Senator J.D. Vance (R-OH), along with other extreme conservative public figures, have made unfounded, racist statements claiming that Haitians from the immigrant community in Springfield, Ohio, are "stealing and eating pet dogs and cats from the residents who live there." There have been no credible reports of pets being stolen, harmed, injured or abused by the Haitian community, according to Springfield city manager and the head of the Springfield police. This has proven to be a lie.

As a result of these false, egregious claims, the nearly 20,000 Haitians who legally live and work in Springfield have been harassed, threatened with bombs, and now fear for their lives.

The General Board of Church and Society and the General Commission on Religion and Race (GCORR) unequivocally condemn the flagrant lies and hate perpetrated against Haitian migrants. You can view the <u>General Board of Church and Society's full statement here</u>. You can view <u>GCORR's statement here</u>.

According to the United Methodist Social Principles, we "affirm the dignity, worth, and rights of migrants, immigrants, and refugees." We further resolve, "as followers of Jesus, to eliminate racism and violence directed toward newly arriving migrants to the United States."

Note from Pastor Peggy: I am deeply grieved at this and other racist statements that have been circulated in this election season. I pray that we as individuals and as the Solon UMC can find ways to reach out with support and positive messages to the immigrant community here in Solon and the Iowa City area. The United Women of Faith and the Treasure Seekers groups have already offered support to the Immigrant Welcome Network in Iowa City.

As in past years, we are looking for donations of gently used or new WARM winter wear, with an emphasis on coats, snow pants, hats, mittens, gloves, scarves, boots & winter shoes. Heavy sweaters & sweatshirts are also appreciated.

United Women in Faith Sept. Missions

Shelter House, Iowa City

The Shelter House in Iowa City has had to resort to passing out tents for the homeless. These are for individuals that are unable to pay the high cost of rental properties in the Iowa City area.

Pictured is Christopher who came to Iowa City from Chicago with hopes of a better life than he had in the big city. Next to him was a woman and her son previously living in Williamsburg. She had lost her job in Williamsburg and came to Iowa City for employment and help in getting on her feet. With the increase in those needing help the Shelter House was asking for hygiene products to pass out to those less fortunate. With Congregational support we were able to deliver approximately \$100 in hygiene products.



Tapestry Farms

On September 14, the United Women in Faith, Golden Valley District Annual Meeting was held at the DeWitt United Methodist Church. Nadine Sojka, Shirley Anderson, Jan Stock, Connie Koeppen and Connie Railsback were in attendance to represent our Solon chapter of UWF. The group meeting collected hygiene products to be given to the Tapestry Farms organization. At that meeting a representative from Tapestry Farms provided information on that organization.

Tapestry Farms generously invests in the lives of refugees who resettle in the Quad Cities. The Tapestry Farms urban farm system reclaims underutilized local land to grow culturally specific fresh produce and flowers. Refugees and volunteers work together in 10 plots throughout the QC, growing regeneratively to benefit our community. Produce is distributed to people in the Quad Cities who live with limited resources, by delivery and through a network of food pantries. We also sell produce at the 100 percent local Quad-Cities Farmers' Market at Schwiebert Park.



Gilda's Club, Quad Cities at Genesis Family Medical Center

Our September Workday was used to create 183 heart pillows and 101 chemotherapy port pillows to be delivered to Gilda's Club Quad Cities. This is our last workday for the creation of comfort pillows for local hospitals in the area. This mission will resume in 2025.

The 2025 SUMC Stewardship Campaign will begin October 6 and continue for the month of October, culminating with Commitment Sunday on October 27.






Printable Pledge Card
