November will be the culmination of months of political campaigning. From what I hear, we are not likely to see a final result of the Presidential race on election night. Results may be very close and challenged in ways that will drag out the response that we hear. So I invite all of us to keep the elections at national, state, county, and local levels in our prayers, that they may bring out our higher values more than fear and

hostility. May we all keep in mind the ways that Jesus and the scriptures call us to love and care for our neighbors and the poor and the immigrants in our land.

In October we had our Stewardship Campaign—Growth through Growing in Christ. We are excited about the ways our ministries are growing, especially reaching children and youth. Thank you to all who have already made a pledge supporting our mission and ministry in 2025! If you have yet to make your financial pledge, it is not too late!

An annual event in United Methodist Church life is the charge conference for each congregation. All members of Solon UMC are invited to attend, and are able to vote at the charge conference, which will take place at First UMC in Iowa City, along with representatives from the 9 others churches in our Iowa City Circuit. This will be on Sunday afternoon, November 10, from 2:30-4:30 pm.

In the church, November will begin with a celebration of All Saints Day. We will gather for communion and for remembering those members and friends of our congregation who have died in the last year. This year we will especially remember Fred Bark, Bob Kabela, and Ruth Ann Richards. We and their families have entrusted them to God's care, and know that they continue to be held in God's love. And yet we still grieve,

because we may be missing them deeply for months and years after their passing. We also give thanks for all the ways that saints of our congregation have helped to leave a legacy through their involvement with Solon UMC.

In November we will also offer gratitude for the diversity within our culture and within The United Methodist Church. Our service on Nov. 10 will focus on African American culture and ministry. On November 17, Rev. Enna Antuñez, from Grace UMC in Tiffin (see her bio on p.10) and I will be having a pulpit exchange. After the 9:00 service here, she and I will together lead the Spanish speaking service in Tiffin at 11:15. On Nov. 24, we will focus on Native American culture and ministries. I will read one version of the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) Thanksgiving Address, which offers greetings to the natural world. In that tradition, the Thanksgiving address is not meant for one day of the year but used at almost every ceremonial gathering. I also hope to arrange a visit to an African American church worship service during November for our confirmation class. Watch for details on this!

May we give thanks to God for our many blessings: for families and friends, for those who have gone before us, for the diversity of neighbors we have in our society, and also keep in mind how we can pass and share those blessings along to others.

This person will work 2 hours every Sunday morning and help coordinate a simple lesson for the 2-3 year olds and be in charge of the nursery. Our confirmation youth met with their mentors on October 9th. They got to know each other by sharing their faith journeys, asking each other questions, and creating items out of marshmallows and spaghetti. On October 16th our youth visited the Solon Food Pantry. They delivered 60 pounds of food. Way to go youth! Our next fun activity was to serve treats for fellowship hour on October 20th. Our middle and high schoolers also hosted a Trunk and Treat at Solon's Monster Mash on October 27th.. The theme is "get hooked on Jesus". We look forward to learning more about our faith, the Bible, and what it means to be a Christian.

Families Helping Families

Families Helping Families of Iowa (FHF) is a non-profit organization designed to help and support children in foster care. Our vision is to create positive opportunities, relationships,

and better overall health for youth in our state who have been moved from their home.

UWF delivered 12 child sized blankets and 18 stocking hats to Families Helping Families.

In-Gathering

This annual event is coordinated by the laity of the Iowa Conference of the United Methodist Church. It is open to anyone wanting to show the love of Christ to the world's people by ministering to their needs.

Foundation 2 - Fostering Futures

The goal of Fostering Futures is to help young people transitioning out of foster care to have the support and resources they need to reach and maintain stability as independent adults.

Services include Iowa aftercare services, Fostering Higher Education, Achieving Maximum Potential (AMP) youth advocacy and peer group, Youth Transition Decision Making, and more. Services are provided in the Cedar Rapids-area.

Clients work with their Foundation 2 caseworker to identify barriers, set goals and work toward stability. Additionally, financial stipends are available for participants who meet the qualifications. Participation in the program is voluntary.

The Foundation 2 Crisis Services' Fostering Futures team can support a young adult with independent living challenges including:

- Housing
- Education
- Employment
- Driver's license
- Budgeting
- Health care

On October 2, UWF hosted representatives from Foundation 2 – Fostering Futures. Katie Curtis and Renae Koth from Fostering Futures explained how children who have aged out of the foster care system in Iowa are assisted to begin life on their own.

One of the main services is to provide a large suitcase of products needed to run a household. With this in mind, members of UWF donated 77 items for Katie and Renae to take with them for use by these young adults and a \$50 donation.

Place your new, unwrapped gift in the collection box by Sunday, December 8. If you prefer, you can donate money and leave the shopping to the Toys for Tots volunteers.



Join in Our Advent Study – On the Way to Bethlehem

On the Way to Bethlehem follows the long journey to Christmas. The story begins in Rome with a decree issued from the seat of worldly power for a census, setting into motion events leading to the birth of the Savior of the world in a town that represents the very opposite of worldly power, Bethlehem. Author Rob Fuquay provides insight into the geographical and historical significance of Rome, Jerusalem, Nazareth, and Bethlehem, along with the important characters through whom the Christmas drama unfolds. You will be drawn into those places in a way that helps you experience the spiritual truths each location holds. The reflection we give in these places prepares the heart and soul to experience wonder, awe, mystery, and joy.

Chapters include: Rome – A Place of Longing; Jerusalem – A Place of Waiting; Nazareth – A Place of Simplicity; and Bethlehem – A Place of Humility.

Sunday morning worship services in Advent will follow the themes from this study.
