In April it was exciting to have an infant baptism — as Jason Moses was baptized! It was also exciting to finish our first year of the Treasure Seekers program! We started up in the fall with primary leadership from Dee Swartzendruber, Randy Mack, and myself, but with no one in the Christian Education staff position. It has been wonderful to see Dee take on more responsibility as she moved into the staff position, and then Eric Swartzendruber started volunteering as well.

This year we have seen a solid core of youth develop into a new youth ministry program, under the committed and caring leadership of Sue Wilkinson and LeeAnn Gilroy. We look forward to sending the youth off on their mission trip at the end of June and beginning of July!

In May we will hear how the international United Methodist General Conference went—April 23 — May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina, and what decisions were made to lead our denomination into the future. In the US, about 23% of churches left the denomination, and about the same percentage in lowa. One of the decisions that will be made by the conference is how churches in other parts of the world will be able to leave the denomination if they choose to do so. Other decisions include changing language and policies to be more welcoming of LGBTQ individuals and ministers, looking at new ways of making decisions in different parts of the world, and whether there are possibilities for online attendance at General Conferences for the future. My hope is that after this General Conference there will be more clarity, more unity, and a hopeful way forward.

I will be on a spiritual growth retreat in Wisconsin for a week during the middle of May, and I will attend the United Methodist Michigan Annual Conference at the end of May and the first Sunday of June. My clergy membership is still with the Michigan Conference for now, so that is where I am asked to attend, and it has been several years since I have seen my Michigan clergy colleagues! I will also attend the Iowa Annual Conference, which is from June 7-9, but I will be here for Sunday morning worship on June 9.

We have experienced many blessings in our first year of ministry together as pastor and congregation! Thank you to the many committed volunteers who make such a variety of ministries possible! I look forward to what lies ahead over the summer and in our second year together!

#### **Treasure Seekers**

What a year we had in Treasure Seekers! We had an average of 10 students participating in many different activities. We broke the year into 5 different sessions.

The first session the students learned about Moses and how he led his people out from Egypt. They even ate locusts made out of Swiss roll cakes and pretzels! They performed a skit for their parents and friends showing them what they had learned from that session. Next, the children studied the blessed event of Jesus' birth. Our students went to the Solon Care Center where they performed a Christmas play, sang carols, and passed out treats to the residents. After winter break the students learned about how Jesus used ordinary people to become his disciples and how He taught them how to be fishers of men. They made snow people and played different types of fishing games. They finished the unit once again with a play showing Jesus asking the fishermen to follow him. We followed this unit with a study of prayer and the book of Luke. This unit reinforced the idea that God

uses people like you and me to spread His love. They learned that it doesn't matter where or what you say in your prayer. A person just needs to talk to God. They learned about the Lord's Prayer. At the end of the session the students learned how to sign the Lord's Prayer to music in American Sign Language. Our very last session we focused on the events surrounding Easter. They learned about the empty tomb by making Resurrection Rolls where their marshmallow representing how Jesus disappeared. They also learned that Jesus gave the disciples instructions after he arose from the grave to spread the word of God to the rest of the world. Besides playing games and doing activities based on what they were learning, for that session we had missions that they participated in. The students had two different drives for our Solon food pantry. The first

one was canned goods, and the second one was personal care items. They went to the Solon care center twice to pass out treats and to sing to the residents. They also made 3 tie fleece blankets to give to refugee families.

We look forward to having another anther fun filled session of learning, activities, and missions this fall. We will be starting sometime in September.

#### **Immigrant Welcome Network of Johnson County**

On April 2 we received a request from Consultation of Religious Communities that read as follows:

"At the Immigrant Welcome Network of Johnson County, a significant aspect of our mission involves providing transitional housing for newly arrived immigrant families for a period of 45 days. During this time, we connect them with social services, enroll their children in school, assist them in finding employment, and ultimately help them secure permanent housing. One family transitioned from the Welcome House to their own apartment on April 1st, and we need your assistance! They require supplies to set up their new home."

The very next day at our monthly meeting members of UWF responded with a total of 161 household items and a \$50 check to support this family!

We have asked this organization to attend our UWF meeting to inform us of their mission and how we can support them in the future. If you would like to know more about them, you are welcome to attend! May 1, in Fellowship Hall, 2:00pm.
