Our Father, who art in heaven . . . Most of us are very familiar with the Lord's prayer. Maybe sometimes even too familiar. We pray it every week in church, and we may say it often enough that we stop thinking about what it means. Most scholars agree that the everyday language that Jesus would have spoken was neither the Hebrew that was used for worship and scripture, nor the Greek language (that the New Testament was written in), but Aramaic. Aramaic is a very old language, that was used in the Middle East. It existed before Arabic, and is more closely related to the Hebrew language than to the Arabic language.

My sermons for July and the first Sunday in August will be based on some very interesting connections and images that are present in the Aramaic language of the Lord's Prayer as Jesus and his followers would have spoken it.

For example, the word "shem" in Aramaic means, "name," and is the word that was used when we say, "Hallowed be thy name." In Hebrew or Aramaic, when you say the name of something or someone, there is a sense that the spirit and power of that thing or person is present—such as praying or doing something "in Jesus' name." The word for "heaven" in Aramaic is "shemayim," which contains the word "shem"—name. So rather than "heaven" being a distant or future place, that we are not connected to, it is the place where God's name and spirit is present and vibrates—which is the whole of creation!

Does it impact how we think about the natural world if we think of God's spirit and power being present in all of the natural things around us, rather than God being away from us in heaven? Especially as we may spend more time outdoors in the summer, try imagining God's spirit and power in creation around you, maybe even offering comfort and guidance to you without words, or calling to you to care for creation in a new way. Let's enjoy exploring together some new meanings that come from Jesus' words in the Lord's prayer, as he would have spoken it!

Updated Rental Policies at SUMC

From Trustees and Church Council -June 2024

Fellowship Hall Rental will be free to all members, active constituents, and nonprofit groups. Other groups and individuals will be charged our regular rental rates.

Family Life Center gym one time events, will be rented to members and active constituents at half of the regular rental rates. (One time event fees: \$50/3 hours regular, \$25/3 hours half price)

There is no charge for SUMC church sponsored events and groups. In most cases those should be open to the public, will be publicized by SUMC, will require any necessary supervision of children and youth according to our Safe Sanctuary policy, and may need approval from the Pastor, Christian Education Director, and/or the Church Council.

Individuals who have a key to the Family Life Center are limited to using the FLC for the days and hours they have reserved and paid for.
