Reflections from Pastor Peggy

Wow! It is hard to believe our first church year together is drawing to a close! We celebrated graduates on May 19, and we've already finished out the year with our Wednesday programming. Sunday school classes are taking a break for the summer, the bell choir played together for the last time this season as Mary Kucera retired on May 12, and the Chancel Choir will be winding down soon! And the Iowa Annual Conference happens June 7-9. I have really appreciated your welcome, and the chance to be back in active United Methodist ministry!

In addition, the larger United Methodist Church has taken some more steps to bring our denomination through a major period of conflict and transition. From April 23 to May 3, United Methodist delegates, both clergy and lay, from around the world, came together to vote on many items relating to the future of our denomination. The conference was originally scheduled to take place in May of 2020, but then COVID hit.

In the four years since then, close to a quarter of US churches left United Methodism, many because they understand homosexuality to be a sin, and no longer want to be part of a denomination that is now welcoming lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender persons into the full range of ministry and ritual. This general conference voted to allow lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people to be ordained and serve as ministers, and with permission for weddings to be performed uniting people of the same gender. At the same time, nothing is mandatory. Individual ministers and congregations will still decide how welcoming they will be to LGBTQ individuals, weddings, and ministers.

I definitely celebrate these actions of welcome and affirmation, but I am also aware that not everyone who has stayed with the denomination of The United Methodist Church is of one mind. We are still a denomination with much diversity, including theological diversity. I pray that we can trust in God's presence and grace working in our midst, and move into a future that does not focus nearly so much on our differences, but on how to share the love that we all have come to know through Jesus Christ.

There were many other kinds of decisions that were made at General Conference that affect the future of our denomination. I invite you to read more about some of those changes here. You may also grab a paper copy in the Narthex.

In our Solon church, we have started a process to reach out more with Jesus' love as a congregation. See a listing in this newsletter of the main projects that drew interest from our recent workshop, and watch for an email, that will include a survey about possible outreach projects for us to do right here in Solon.

I close with a letter from our Iowa bishop, Bishop Kennetha Bigham-Tsai:

"My heart breaks that more tornadoes have hit Iowa. Greenfield was devasted, with at least four people killed and many wounded. Homes and businesses were destroyed. Other communities were also impacted by extreme thunderstorms and flooding.

Please keep these communities in prayer. And please pray for our whole state for the destructive impact of these storms. In addition to harming people and infrastructure, tornadoes damage farmland and crops, kill livestock and other animals. All of God's creation groans under the weight of such storms.



May the absorbing spirit of God's love blot your problems, soak up your sorrows and wipe away difficulties. May your journey in life be always bright and shining in your work and love towards others.


