It's hard to believe fall leaves, fresh apples, and pumpkins along with many other signs of fall are soon on their way! School is almost ready to start as I write this, and Labor Day is around the corner!

And the election season has been building, with almost daily polling numbers on the Presidential candidates. Many of us have noticed the polarization around politics. There is often little respect for people of differing views, and it is often easier to not talk about politics unless you know you are with people who agree with you.

I have chosen to use a sermon and worship series for September called "Do Unto Others." It is focused on how we can live out the values of kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love in the midst of the anxiety of an election season. Outlines for worship and themes and some graphic designs are provided by a combination of folks at Rev. Adam

Hamilton's Resurrection United Methodist Church in Kansas City, and by Marcia McFee, who runs the Worship Design Studio. If you'd like to be part of this message of kindness in an election season, we will be offering yard signs and stickers that you can order with the logo of a heart that is part blue, part red, and part purple with the words of Jesus, "Do Unto Others" in the purple section. Next to the heart is the word "kindness." Click HERE if you are interested in yard signs or stickers.



Politics is one way that we live out our values in the world, so it is not something that we can or should avoid altogether in church. We do, however, want to avoid disrespectful political arguments, and instead talk about how we can express the values that we hold in ways that reflect the love of God for all people. What do the proposed budgets or policies of either party or various candidates say about their priorities and values? What does the character of a particular candidate say about how they will lead our country or our state or our county or our town as we face many challenges? Do their words and policies allow more voices to be heard, or try to limit whose voices can be heard? Are there groups of people that are discounted or disrespected? Does a candidate speak in ways that promote fear and anger, or promote working together for creative solutions? Do they find ways to give ordinary people more of a say and sense of control in their future? Do they provide a vision that calls us to be the best that we can be?

How do you want to be treated? How can we help others to also be treated in the same way? May we find ways to live out Jesus' words to "Do unto others as you would have them to do unto you," even, and especially, in an election season.
