God cares about the people that human societies would prefer to ignore, and he remembers those whom most people would prefer to forget.

You'll notice several things if you search for the words "widow," "fatherless," or "sojourner" in the Bible. First, you'll notice that those words show up together a lot in the scriptures. Apparently, God pays particular attention to people in these categories, and he expects his people to notice them too.

Another thing that you cannot help but see in the scriptures is that God measures the righteousness and justice of a society based upon how these people are treated. Those who care for the downtrodden are seen by God as doing something righteous; those who oppress them are seen not merely as doing bad things, but as God's enemies who provoke his wrath.

What these three words have in common is that they describe people that ancient societies would find very easy to oppress. In most societies they are mistreated. People can take advantage of these people because they do not have anyone who would naturally defend them - a husband, a father, or a fellow countryman. To this day, because they are vulnerable, in most societies the live in powerlessness and danger, without guaranteed rights or expectation of security.

But where God's will, nature, and authority are recognized, the vulnerability of people like these becomes their shield, rather than mistreat them or ignore them, the heart of the godly person is compelled to care for them. Their cries of desperation are heard by both God and the godly. Where God is king over people, they know that his heart is for the weak and defenseless, the meek of the earth, the subjugated, persecuted, oppressed, and abused. His greatest redemptive act in the Old Testament was to rescue slaves, and Jesus death on the cross was for those who could not rescue themselves.

In our own lives, we may not actively mistreat the poor or the defenseless, but we might be tempted to ignore them, to mistrust them, to shy away from them. We must never forget that Jesus was homeless. Our king chose to identify with the people on the margins of this world - prostitutes, tax collectors, and sinners. Jesus heart was moved with compassion towards those who were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. He was drawn to care for people that his world rejected. He did not ignore the broken lives of the meek, but he loved them, ate with them, went to their parties. They were people to him.

Jesus cared about them when he walked this earth, and he cares for them still. Those who embarrass and anger this world, those this world would mistreat and reject - these are beloved to him. Everything in his behavior tells us that we must live according the heart of God and care for the widow, the orphan, the stranger, the homeless, the poor, and the oppressed.

The needs of the needy can be inconvenient for those who have means rather than needs. It's easy to turn away. But God calls the godly to act: to extend resources, time, compassion and love to those this world ignores. We must not close our eyes or ears. We must hear, see, and act.
