



Why did Jesus tell so many stories? When you look through his repertoire of tales, there is guite a collection of characters and strange situations. There is a father with two sons, neither of whom seems to understand him. There is a foolish traveler on a dangerous back road, predictably beaten to a pulp by bandits, ignored by the religious, and rescued by a walking scandal. There is a widow who won't leave a government official alone, a manger who rips off his boss by colluding with creditors to forge debt certificates, a farmer who doesn't seem to care where he throws his seeds, and a rich man who ignored a poor man named

Lazarus only to find himself experiencing an unexpected afterlife reversal of fortunes. And there are still a bunch more! These stories are familiar to many of us - so much so that

these one-sentence summaries are enough to bring the whole story to mind for many of us. But why did he tell them?

There is something powerful about a story. It sneaks past our defenses in a way that a mere theoretical argument cannot. Imagine I said to you, "The real purpose of wealth is not for your own comfort, but wealth's purpose is so that we can express our love for people." You might be able to poke all kinds of holes in an argument like that. After all, wealth most certainly can provide me with comfort. And why shouldn't it? After all, I earned it, didn't I? And why should I give it away for the sake of people who didn't earn it?

But if I told you a story about an accountant who is in trouble with his boss because of mismanagement, suddenly you are invested in his problems. You aren't trying to shoot holes in the argument, you are wanting to learn how he gets out of his tight spot.

And then, when you are invested in the plot, Jesus will show you a truth that you might have resisted. The manager in trouble uses money to improve his relationships instead of buying comforting things with it. Well, of course, he does, you might argue. He's in trouble and trying to figure out how to get out of it. But then, your mind will ask you, aren't we all in trouble with our God? Aren't I in trouble with him? Suddenly, Jesus's story has you thinking in ways that you might have fought with or rejected.

Jesus is a master storyteller and a brilliant theologian. His stories are meant to lead us to consider truths that we might have missed. We might have resisted some of his harder ideas if he had just said them to us plainly. So he told them to us slanted, squeezing them into stories.

A wise person will ponder over the stories of Jesus, meditating on them and ruminating over them. A contemplative approach to the parables will make space for a receptive heart to be given great gifts by God.

In this morning's sermon, we are going to get to hear one of Jesus's most famous stories. Open your heart to it and allow the wonder to sink deeply into you.
