



When Jesus Christ came into this world, he built a community. He started small - at first just a few friends. Before long, he had a group of twelve men who were his closest friends, and he drew them together so that they could be with him (Mark 3:14). The twelve were where he invested most of his time, but of course there were many other men and women beyond that group that Jesus drew into his earliest community - he had seventy two people that he knew well enough, who had enough training, that he sent out as his representatives (Luke 10:1, 17). Especially in Luke's gospel, we are often presented with a crowd of people thronging around Jesus. Jesus came to

build a community and he succeeded. At the end of Jesus life, though, a strange thing happens: Jesus's most intimate community - the twelve - came together one last time and had a special dinner with him, and then they all ran away and left him. They all abandoned him at his most desperate hour, giving him up into the hands of his enemies. When he died, the community he had so lovingly built also died.

When he was raised from the dead, the community he had assembled was also raised from the dead. Part of the reason the resurrection appearances are so central to the gospel (see 1 Corinthians 15:4-8) is because it is Jesus's living presence that makes the church what it is. While he lived, it lived and grew. When he died, it died with him. When he was raised from the dead, it came back into life. Because he will never die, the church will endure on the earth until the end of time. The community lives because Jesus does.

Jesus lives as the Lord of each one of us, and as the King of all of us. His work in us draws us together into close relationships, whether we like it or not. Sin makes us fear one another (with good reason), and the selfishness of our condition causes us to compete with one another, driving us into conflict and trouble. Our fallen nature would prefer not to have the strings of relationship attached to us, but Jesus binds us together with chords that cannot be broken. And of course, we find that because it is the work of Jesus, it is good to be drawn into unexpected friendships with one another. Love is better than loneliness, and the security we feel in self-protective isolation pales when compared to the delightful risks of companionship.

When Christians share their lives together in unity, discovering the delight of trusting one another, becoming vulnerable to each other, bearing one another's burdens, and accepting each other in the struggle against sin, something amazing happens: Jesus, who first came to build community, builds his community among them again. As it always was, the community of Jesus is a community with a mission; the redemption of the world. We love one another so that we can share Jesus's love with the world.

This morning, we pray for the community of Jesus, that we can be the community that he intends. We live because he does, and we love one another because he does. We forgive because we are forgiven, and we have a mission because he has drawn us into it.
