#### WHAT IS CHRISTLIKENESS?

Having come into the church as a high school student, my vocabulary surrounding the experience expanded with every Sunday service and youth retreat. One term that became part of my Christian vernacular was the word "Christlikeness". To this day, I don't believe I have ever had someone sit down to delineate exactly what is meant by it. Perhaps that's because it seems somewhat self-explanatory. Christlikeness is to be like Christ. However, my teachers always said you can't define a word by using the word. So, this article will be an attempt to discuss Christlikeness in the hopes that our own path to Christian maturity might be aided by our understanding of it.

The Biblical basis for the call to Christlikeness is not a single Bible text, for the basis is far more substantial than can be summed up in one verse of scripture. The basis consists of three texts which we will do well to hold together: Romans 8:29, II Corinthians 3:18, and I John 3:2.

Romans 8:29 For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. (Continued on page 9)

THE WESTMINSTER LARGER CATECHISM

### Q. 71. HOW IS JUSTIFICATION AN ACT OF GOD'S FREE GRACE?

**A.** By his obedience and death Christ made the correct, real, and full satisfaction to God's justice on behalf of those who are justified.<sup>1</sup> Yet, insofar as this satisfaction is accepted by God as a guarantee of performance, which he might have demanded from the justified, and since God himself provided a guarantor in the person of his only Son,<sup>2</sup> in justification God imputes righteousness to the justified<sup>3</sup> and requires nothing from them in return except faith,<sup>4</sup> which they also have as a gift from him.<sup>5</sup> Consequently, justification comes to the justified as an act of God's free grace.<sup>6</sup>



#### First Presbyterian Church of Greenville Ohio Minutes of the Session of March 14, 2024

#### I. Opening

#### A. Call meeting to order with reading of the Word and prayer

The March 2024 stated meeting of the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Greenville was called to order on March 14, 2024 at First Presbyterian Church at 7:00 PM by Pastor Andrew Gilman. Pastor Gilman opening the meeting with prayer.

**Members Present:** Pam Bowman, Lisa Headley, Peter Haviza, Randy Tester, Jan Roestamadji, and Craig Leland (6). Quorum was met.

Members Absent: Rebecca Detling and John Vehre, Clerk of Session.

Guests: Katie Watern (potential new member of First Presbyterian), Paige Ervin

Pastor Gilman asked for a volunteer to keep the minutes due to the absence of Clerk of Session. Lisa Headley volunteered to keep the minutes.

**Approval of Agenda** A motion was made to approve the agenda, by Jan Roestamadji and seconded by Peter Haviza. The motion passed 6-0.

**New Member** Katie Watern gave her testimony for joining the church. She stated her reasons for requesting membership are in part due to Pastor Gilman's sermons that bring her healing, joy, strength, and peace. Jan Roestamadji acted as Katie's sponsor. The session members each asked Katie questions to get to know her and to affirm that she has accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior. After this, Jan and Katie left the room so the session could vote. Peter Haviza made the motion to approve Katie Watern for membership to First Presbyterian, seconded by Pam Bowman. The motion passed 5-0 with Jan abstaining.

Approval of Minutes After reading the minutes, Randy Tester asked for one correction. In the paragraph for the Building Committee, he asked that the last sentence be corrected to say that "Randy also indicated that he would like to look into new vendors, and also wants to establish better relationships with all vendors" (not just North Star Hardware). After discussion and agreement, Peter Haviza made the motion to accept the minutes of the February 8, 2024, Session Meeting. Pam Bowman seconded the motion. The motion passed 6-0.

#### II. Agenda Items

Presbytery Review February Pastor Gilman thanked all who helped with the

Presbytery meeting. He discussed the feedback he received from others in attendance which was all positive and called our attention to the Midwest Presbytery Review summary. He also passed a thank you card around from Karen Henninger who thanked session for their hard work on the renovations.

**Presentation of the Annual Church Report (ACR) to Session** It was found that the Annual Church Report was not given to First Presbyterian Greenville session members as is required. After discussion it was decided that the ACR will become a standard document in the February session meetings in the future. Randy Tester made the motion to accept the Annual Church Report given to session on this date. It was seconded by Jan Roestamadji. The motion passed 6-0.

**Presbytery Vote and General Assembly Commissioners** The session members discussed upcoming Presbytery meeting, date and locations. After discussion, the session commissioned Craig Leland to attend the meeting May 10-11, 2024 at Oakhill Presbyterian Church in Grand Rapids, MI.

A proposal was brought to session for Paige and Kelsey Ervin to attend the General Assembly at Hope Church in Cordova, TN on June 18-20, 2024. In order for this to happen a fundraising letter needs to be sent to the congregation asking for donations to help incur expenses for travel, hotel and childcare at the General Assembly. After discussion, Peter Haviza made the motion to approve the letter as presented to the congregation, seconded by Jan Roestamadji. The motion carried 6-0.

**Tornado Warning** At this time, the city's tornado sirens went off and the session members moved the meeting into the basement for safety. (Paige Ervin joined the meeting at this time as she was in the building during the tornado warning as well.)

**Building Committee Report** Randy Tester brought forth an estimate from E&M Lawn Maintenance, LLC in the amount of \$960 for landscaping and clean-up for 2024. The cost does not include new bushes as E&M is still in the process of sourcing them. Amanda Hines, who has volunteered to fill the planters by the narthex entry will consult with E&M for more landscaping needs in areas affected by the renovation. A separate cost for this portion of the project will be presented to the session at a later date. A motion to accept this proposal was made by Pam Bowman and seconded by Craig Leland. The motion carried 6-0.

**Building Use Policy Change** The proposal was for the session to grant the Head of Staff and the Director of Ministry Operations to grant permission for building use. Pam Bowman led a discussion on liability insurance related to building use. This proposal was TABLED until the Building Use Contract is approved and until Pastor Gilman can check the amount of liability insurance the church carries.

**Bike Rack** A proposal was brought forth by Randy Tester for the Session of EPC to purchase a bike rack not to exceed \$200 to accommodate people biking to the church. Randy provided an estimate of \$151.96 from Global Industrial. Jan Roestamadji made the motion to purchase the bike rack, seconded by Peter Haviza. The motion carried 6-0

Randy Tester then read the building report reflecting the first of 4 quarterly reviews of the church. The review concentrated on the kitchen and areas involved with the renovation. There were found to be 15 items to be addressed, 10 of which were directed to the renovation punch list items. Additional reviews will take place in May, August, and November 2024.

**Outreach Mission Festival of the Risen King** Paige Ervin came into the meeting at this point and gave a presentation on this outreach ministry to the community. There is a request from the planning staff for permission to raise money for this event slated for April 27, 2024, from the community. The event has a total cost of approximately \$4,000. In order to offset this cost, the committee would like to gather sponsors from local businesses. The committee also requested that the session members act as representatives and deliver flyers to local business leaders. An advertisement/appeal flier was provided for session members. A deadline for sponsorship was set at 4/15/2024. Jan Roestamadji then made the motion to raise support via sponsorship from local businesses to off-set costs associated with the Festival of the Risen King. The motion was seconded by Craig Leland. The motion carried 6-0.

**Insurance Policy Adjustment Post** A Commercial Estimator Result from Littman Thomas Insurance Agency was provided to the session to show adjustments to the policy after the renovation. To coordinate this item with discussion earlier regarding liability insurance for Building Use, Peter Haviza suggested the session see a copy of the declarations page at the next meeting. The Estimator Results show a Replacement Cost Summary of \$6.792 Million. There was no vote taken and the item was TABLED.

Parish Life A written request on how to fund/budget coffee hour in the Nook was brought to the session from Rebecca Detling. A Hospitality Team has been formed who will prepare, host, and clean up the Nook. A list of approximate expenses totaling \$1821 per year was provided. This figure may increase due to any special events. Discussion followed on how to fund this important mission of the church. A motion was made by Peter Haviza to add this expense to the budget as soon as possible. After more discussion of expenses vs donations already in place, Jan Roestamadji revised the motion to just keep track of expenses until the end of 2024, then fold this expense into a line-item in the budget for 2025. Craig Leland seconded the motion. The vote carried.

Finance Report January and February Jan Roestamadji gave a detailed financial report. She noted that the February giving was at a historical low point. She asked the session to be in prayer to increase monthly giving by the congregation. Trust and Income is showing a negative figure due to the renovation. She asked for patience as the committee is in transition. It was suggested that a meeting between the Trust Committee, Finance Committee, Marnelise van der Walt, and John Vehre be scheduled after Marnelise's return from her trip. Jan stated she would organize this informational meeting. Peter Haviza moved to accept the finance report, Lisa Headley seconded the motion. The vote carried 6-0

Mission Committee Report World Outreach (the Mission arm of EPC) has invited Pastor Gilman to teach a class to pastors in central Asia. He would like to leave the US on 7/1/24 and stay in-country for 10 days to teach. World Outreach is covering the cost of the airfare. He requested session support for the hotel and a per diem for the duration of the trip. Pastor Gilman gave a rough idea of the expense of \$1500 to include lodging, food, and study materials for all 20 students. Craig Leland made the motion to approve Pastor Gilman's request and to fund the trip for up to \$1750 using money from the Mission account. Peter Haviza seconded the motion. The motion carried 6-0.

**Pastor's Report (Andrew Gilman – written submission)** Pastor Gilman read his report and stated a total of 16 worship services for February and March 2024. Pastor has requested vacation July 8-July 25, 2024. He will be missing a total of 3 Sundays from the pulpit and has already found pulpit supply for 2 Sundays. The third Sunday will be pre-planned by Pastor Gilman but executed by members of the church as a whole. A short discussion of the upcoming ribbon cutting ceremony was discussed. Randy Tester made the motion to accept the Pastor's Report, seconded by Peter Haviza. The motion carried 6-0.

**Deacon's Report** Pastor Gilman then read the Deacon's Report. A motion was made by Peter Haviza to accept the report, seconded by Craig Leland. The motion carried 6-0.

#### III. Closing

**Prayer.** A closing prayer was made by Jan Roestamadji.

**Adjournment.** With no further business to discuss, a motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Jan Roestamadji and seconded by Peter Haviza. The motion carried 6-0.

#### WHAT IS CHRISTLIKENESS? (CONT.)

When Adam fell, he lost much (though not all) of the divine image in which he had been created. But God restored it in Christ. Conformity to the image of God means to be like Jesus, and Christlikeness is the eternal predestining purpose of God in a believer's life toward that end.

Il Corinthians 3:18 And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.

If Romans highlights the eternal perspective of God for your life, this verse shifts that perspective to the present transformation of a believer by the Holy Spirit; from God's eternal purpose to make us like Jesus, to his historical work by His Spirit to transform us into the image of Jesus.

I John 3:2 Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is.

So if God has an eternal plan or blueprint for our becoming like Jesus, and He is currently at work through the Holy Spirit to implement that plan, it is no wonder that God calls us here in this third Bible verse, to participate or cooperate with Him in this endeavor.

Jesus says "Follow Me". He says "Imitate Me". When Jesus says this to a disciple or follower of His, the future is somewhat uncertain from our human point of view. Follow you where Lord? Imitate you how? But ultimately we have and know all we need for the task. We know that we are to be like Christ and we Know the Holy Spirit is with us; indwelling us, as we set out on the journey of discipleship.

Having established the Biblical basis for Christlikeness, I want to now move to illustrate this truth with a number of NT examples.

#### We are to be like Christ in His incarnation

Incarnation is a big fancy theological word. What do you mean be like Jesus in His incarnation? The concept is not that we are or ever were somehow divine or eternal; only Jesus is those things. However, we are told by the Apostle Paul to be like Jesus in His incarnation.

Philippians 2:5-8 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Here we have many specific directives on how we are to be like Jesus in his thoughts, and actions toward people He condescended to be with and to save. Service, humility and sacrifice are just a few of the themes we can spend time meditating on as we seek to be like Jesus.

#### We are to be like Christ in His service

We see this exemplified for us in the Upper Room. Jesus washes His disciples' feet in an act of service and humility toward them. In some ways we take this image very literally. We have a foot washing service on Maundy Thursday each year commemorating and reenacting this with one another. But the real point of that service is not to be so literal as to see service as washing another's feet. Our feet don't get as dirty as their's did in sandals and dust of Jesus' day. This is largely symbolic for us. Symbols point to the thing symbolized which in this case is the need to be like Jesus in how we serve others.

#### We are to be like Christ in His love

Jesus famously summed up the law of God in the two greatest commands. Love God and love your neighbor. But perhaps the most striking place to see the need to imitate Christ in His love is found in Ephesians.

Ephesians 5:2 And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

To live a life of love is a command that all our behavior should be characterized by. Christ loved

us by giving Himself up for us while we were yet sinners. This was the demonstration of Christ's love toward you. So Paul is urging us to be like Jesus in His death, to love others with Calvary Love.

Do you see what is happening? Paul is urging us to be the incarnation of Jesus, to be servants like Jesus, and to sacrifice in love like Jesus on the cross.

#### We are to be like Christ in His mission

We have seen the Great Commandment now let us look at the Great Commission. It is called the Great Commission because it is a CO-mission. Jesus makes an appeal to us as His followers to live lives that are engaged in the completion of the mission He came and started. It is the work of spreading the truth of God's Kingdom throughout the world that God created.

This mission is immensely significant. We are sent into the world. Indeed, we cannot complete this mission unless we are willing to get into other peoples' worlds. Sharing life with others with the purpose of pointing them to Jesus is part and parcel of the Christian life. You might say that to

live without a commitment to this Mission Command from the Bible is to live a life diametrically opposed to the work of God in your own life. We might ask the question: Could you be considered to be like Jesus if you were not about the work of spreading the message of God's love to the World.

John 3:16 For God so loved the world that He sent His only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

In the Upper Room on the night before His death Jesus prayed "As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them (His followers) into the world". We are to be Christlike in His mission.

So in summary, God's purpose is to make us Christlike. He does this by filling us with the Holy Spirit. And He is inviting you to a life of taking His call to follow Him seriously. We are disciples, and followers of Jesus. This means that we love like Jesus, we serve like Jesus, we get into people's lives like Jesus, and we are on mission with Jesus to reach the world with the gospel.

Let's be a church of Christlike followers in all we do this summer at FPC.

The kids are still enjoying their new rooms and toys during children's church!








#### FESTIVAL THANK YOU
