As Presbyterians, we enjoy a form of Church government that is connectional between our own congregation and the many other congregations in our region (Midwest Presbytery) as well as EPC churches across America. There are 627 congregations with 125,000 members in our denomination. These member congregations are invited once a year to attend the General Assembly. This year that meeting will take place in Memphis Tennessee from June 18th – 20th.

Ecclesiastical meetings of this nature may seem to some as if they would be a tremendous burden and a bore. However, having attended 4 General Assembly meetings, I can assure you that these are joyful and fulfilling meetings. Each day begins and concludes with worship. At each service a sermon is delivered by some of the best Bible expositors of our denomination. The break times are filled with visiting between old friends and former colleagues. Breakout sessions are an excellent time to make new friends.

The days at General Assembly are long. They begin at 9AM and often wrap up at 8PM after evening worship. (Continued on page 9)



I. **Opening**

A. Call meeting to order with reading of the Word and prayer

The April 2024 stated meeting of the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Greenville was called to order on April 11, 2024 at First Presbyterian Church at 7:10 PM by Pastor Andrew Gilman. Pastor Gilman opening the meeting with prayer.

Members Present: Pam Bowman, Lisa Headley, Rebecca Detling, Peter Haviza, Randy Tester, Craig Leland, and Jan Roestamadji (7). Quorum was met.

Members Absent: None

Guests: None

Approval of Agenda A motion was made to approve the agenda with modifications including payment for dinners in May and Fall study school series by Pam Bowman and seconded by Jan Roestamadji. The motion passed 7-0.

Approval of Minutes Jan Roestamadji motioned to approve the March 2024 minutes. This motion was seconded by Peter Haviza. The motion passed 7-0.

II. Agenda Items

FYI Leadership Ladder Andrew Gilman presented a small part of chapter 9 from the book: *The Leadership Ladder*. This ladder entails steps towards building biblical knowledge and outlines living missionally, making disciples, mobilizing ministry, leading ministry, leading leaders and planting churches. The discussion resulting turned around how this might apply to our church leaders. After the discussion, Andrew also mentioned that 100 people have preregistered for the upcoming Festival of the Risen King.

FYI Baptism and Sharing faith Pastor Gilman informed us that Mylee Hines and Meeka Conley are interested in professing their faith and in Mylee's case having a baptism. Andrew noted that this profession of faith will take place for both on April 14, 2024 at 9 AM. Two members of session are requested to witness this as well. If confirmed Meeka will be baptized on April 28 and Mylee will be able to attend her first communion on May 5, 2024.

Financial Report Jan Roestamadji presented a brief report in which the highlights were mentioning that \$15,048 was given in March and that otherwise it was a quiet month for expenses. John Vehre, Craig Leland, and Randy Tester also reported on the status of the building expenses and other outstanding loose ends. Craig indicated that \$118,557 have been collected in pledges with another \$100,000 yet to be collected. JV indicated that a fourth invoice had been received from Bruns bringing the total amount billed up to \$608,545.93. There is still roughly \$15,041.65 in expenses yet to be paid. JV also reported that change orders had added \$17,440.93 to the cost of the project. Randy Tester stated that most punch order items have been met, but he is still reviewing a handful of items that need to be verified.

Midwest Presbytery in Grand Rapids, Michigan Andrew Gilman will be attending this meeting, which will be taking place from May 10-11, 2024. Andrew also asked if any on session would also like to attend. Jan Roestamadji indicated interest and a motion was made to commission her to attend the meeting. The motion was made by Pam Bowman and seconded by Craig Leland. The motion passed 7-0.

General Assembly in Cordova, TN. Pastor Gilman also indicated that he will be attending this conference, which is taking place from June 18-20, 2024. Paige and Kelsey Ervin also will be attending, but no vote is required on this as neither Paige nor Kelsey are members of session.

Documentation on Building and authority to grant building use. Pastor Gilman reviewed documents and costs on building use and noted a desire for staff to be allowed to authorize Groups to use our facilities. A motion worded *The Session of FPC grants the head of staff and the director of ministry operations the authority to grant permission for building use.* This motion was made by Jan Roestamadji and seconded by Pam Bowman. The motion passed 7-0.

Mother's Day and Father's Day gifts (Parish Life) The Deacons recently determined that they would rather make a monetary donation to the youth ministries of the church rather than spend their budget on flowers for Mother's Day. After discussing the ramifications of this and the lack of a budget for parish life as well, a motion was made worded: *The Session of FPC hereby votes to provide something small for ladies of the church on Mother's Day and men of the church on Father's Day as part of our ongoing hospitality ministries to the body of FPC and visitors*. Peter Haviza made the motion, which was seconded by Jan Roestamadji and passed 7-0.

Scholarship Committee Formation The scholarship commission is hereby formed on April 11, 2024 and will be dissolved upon the completion of its task on May 19, 2024. The following names are given authority by the session to make these decisions on their behalf for the 2024 disbursement year: Rany Tester, Jan Roestamadji, Amanda Hines, Kathy Lockhart, and Paige Ervin. Peter Haviza made the motion, seconded by Pam Bowman, and passing 7-0.

FYI Session Committees Heads of the various committees reported on the rosters of their committees for 2024. Committees are complete with the possible exception of the nominating committee.

Trust Committee (Randy Tester) Randy reported that there is a meeting of this committee scheduled for May 2, 2024. He also indicated that there are plans for updating the Investment Policy Statement.

Executive Session A motion was made by Jan Roestamadji to enter executive session, seconded by Pam Bowman and passing 7-0. After 5 or 10 minutes of discussion, session left executive session and resumed normal business.

Pastor's Report Pastor Gilman submitted a written report and orally reviewed highlights. Lisa Headley motioned to accept the report seconded by Randy Tester and passing 7-0.

Deacon's Meeting A written Deacon's report was submitted to session. After reviewing it a motion was made by Lisa Headley to accept the report, seconded by Pam Bowman, and passing 7-0.

III. Closing

Prayer. A closing prayer was made by Jan Roestamadji.

Adjournment. Jan Roestamadji motioned to adjourn, which was seconded by Rebecca Detling. The motion passed 7-0.

The schedule includes finding spaces for meetings and classrooms in a large unfamiliar church building. We, as a committee, are responsible for equipping sessions throughout the week. We have invited Sam Rainer as a guest speaker. He is a well known author and consultant on church revitalization. His most recent book is "The Surprising Return of the Neighborhood Church".

This will be a large part of my week at the General Assembly participating in these sessions as a leader alongside the rest of the team and Sam Rainer. We have over 600 people registered for our various sessions and seminars.

Paige and Kelsey Ervin are also attending the General Assembly this year. The thing that excites me most about their participation is the opportunity for both of them to see the larger part of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church gather and worship together. Kelsey will have the added benefit of meeting with the Next Gen ministries group over the course of the week. This is a gathering of young ministers and lay people from across the country who are committed to doing ministry to the next generation.

Since Kelsey is now a key part of our church's mission to our youth this is an excellent way to rub shoulders with and glean ministry experience from a host of people who are doing this important work all across the country. Please be in prayer for Kelsey as she goes into a larger world of ministry. Pray that she makes some new friends and contacts as well as gathers some inspiration and insight through the conversations and seminars she participates in.

As you all know Paige has been an indispensible part of our staff here at FPC for a few years now. Please pray for her as she enjoys the worship and also gathers with others in administration portions of ministry from many churches throughout the denomination.
