First Presbyterian Church of Greenville Ohio Minutes of the Session of November 9, 2023

I. Opening

A. Call meeting to order with reading of the Word and prayer

The November 2023 stated meeting of the Session of First Presbyterian Church of Greenville was called to order on November 9, 2023 at First Presbyterian Church at 7:15 PM (due to the late arrival of the clerk) by Pastor Andrew Gilman. Pastor Gilman opening the meeting with prayer.

Members Present: Pam Bowman, Wes Jetter, Jan Roestamadji, Helen Miller Peter Haviza, Craig Leland and Randy Tester (7)

Members Absent: None

Guests: Paige Ervin

Approval of Agenda A motion was made to approve the docket with additional Worship Committee discussions by Jan Roestamadji and seconded by Craig Leland. The motion passed 7-0.

Approval of Minutes Pam Bowman motioned to approve the October 2023 minutes. This motion was seconded by Wes Jetter. The motion passed 7-0.

II. Agenda Items

Financial Report No written financial report was given tonight, because of Marnelise's trip to South Africa. Craig Leland did report that a first run had been made at putting together a budget for 2024 and a meeting, which lasted about two and a half hours, took place on November 7.

Renovation Project Pam Bowman and Paige Ervin gave an update on furniture choices for the building project. After meeting with representatives for Innovation Office Solutions and selecting furnishings they have recommended that the church allocate \$70,000 towards this portion of the project. This amounted to roughly 12,000 for office furnishings and the remainder for the other renovated areas of the project. A motion was made by Randy Tester worded: *The Session agrees to move forward with the purchase of new furnishings through Innovative Office Solutions for the amount of \$70,0000*, which was seconded by Peter Haviza and passed 7-0.

Additionally, Pam and Paige recommend that Session support, in the amount of \$5,000, the acquisitions of toys and various other miscellaneous items outside of the scope for furniture for the three class rooms. Expenditures may exceed that amount, but Paige and Pam indicated that the amount spent beyond \$5,000 would be met by a fund raiser. Jan Roestamadji made a motion worded: *The session agrees to purchase any remaining items on the committee's registry for the children's classrooms up to \$5,000*. This was seconded by Wes Jetter and passed by a margin of 7-0.

John Vehre reported that the building project had 7 change orders occur since he lasted reported in October. Some of these changes have resulted in cost savings, but overall, \$10,560.90 has been added to the cost of the project through these alterations. JV also mentioned that these additional costs have not caused the project to exceed the 1/3-2/3 ratio between fund raising and investment contributions toward the project outlined and approved by an earlier Church Congregational meeting.

Annual Reviews of Rolls While the church's membership dues to the Presbytery are no longer tied to a per capita cost, it is still useful to update the membership rolls on an annual basis. Session reviewed the membership rolls during the November meeting. A series of motions were made related to these changes.

The Session of FPC hereby adds (Tish Shepherd, Elaine (Snyder) Hawley, Dan Hawley, Alex Thomas and Shannon Thomas to the active roll. Additionally, the Session of FPC hereby adds (Philip Gilmore, Ruth Gilmore, Brice Thomas and Samuel Howell to the baptized roll. The Session also adds (Frank and Nikki Gilmore to the active list. Peter Haviza motioned to accept these additions to the active roll, seconded by Jan Roestamadji and passing by a 7-0 margin.

Session also moved 19 members from the active roll to the inactive roll. A motion was then made by Pam Bowman to

approve this update, seconded by Peter Haviza, and passing by 7-0. Fran Nord due to her recent death was also removed from the active roll a motion being made to the effect by Wes Jetter and seconded by Craig Leland. The motion passed 7-0.

Session also reviewed the Inactive rolls and removed 10 individuals from that list. Pam Bowman motioned to make those changes, seconded by Helen Miller and passing 7-0.

Nominating Committee (Peter Haviza) Peter reported that a slate of candidates had been found both for Session and the Deacons, and he made the following motion: *The Session puts forward the following names for vote to the office of Elder, class of 2027: Lisa Headley and Rebecca Detling. Additionally, Session puts forward the following names for vote to the office of Deacon, class of 2027: Kelsy Ervin, Jenna Gilman, and Nikki Gilmore.* This motion was seconded by Jan Roestamadji and passed 7-0.

FYI Committee Assignments Andrew had drawn up committee assignments for 2024. Mission Committee: Craig Leland, Worship Committee: Lisa Headly, Finance Committee: Jan Roestamadji, Building Committee: Randy Tester, Parish Life Committee: Rebecca Detling, Personnel Committee: Pam Bowman and Nominating Committee: Peter Haviza.

Worship Committee (Jan Roestamadji) Jan reported that some new materials for worship were needed. The new materials she discussed involved the sacraments. No vote was needed.

Employee Payroll Changes for 2024 To discuss COLA adjustments and other changes, the session moved into executive session and had Andrew Gilman leave the room. A motion was made by Peter Haviza and seconded by Craig Leland to move into executive session. The motion passed 7-0. After several minutes of discussion pay changes were proposed and session then left executive session. A motion being made by Peter and Craig again to leave, passing 7-0. The following changes were agreed upon. Paige Ervin and Ben Clark will not receive any adjustments for 2024. Lori Conway will receive a \$1.00 an hour increase. Marnelise van der Walt, Andrew Gilman and Terri Fryman will receive 3% increases. A motion to accept these changes was made by Jan Roestamadji and seconded by Wes Jetter. The motion passed 7-0.

Pastor's Report (Andrew Gilman – written submission) Pastor Gilman submitted a written report of his activities for October. Due to the lateness of the hour, he skipped the oral summation. Pam Bowman motioned to accept the report, seconded by Peter Haviza, and passing by a margin of 7-0.

Deacon's Meeting A written report was submitted for the November 5, 2023 meeting. After session reviewed the report, a motion was made by Craig Leland to accept it, seconded by Wes Jetter and passing 7-0.

III. Closing

Prayer. A closing prayer was made by Jan Roestamadji.

Adjournment. Peter Haviza motioned to adjourn, which was seconded by Wes Jetter. The motion passed 7-0.


