<sup>13</sup> ...we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope.<sup>14</sup> For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. <sup>17b</sup> and so we will be with the Lord forever.<sup>18</sup> Therefore encourage one another with these words. *1 Thessalonians 4:13-14, 17b-18* 

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Every single Thanksgiving, every single anniversary of her death, and every single Christmas Eve my mom mourned her grandmother, Alice Mae Balliet, who EVERYONE called "Mom." I can remember as a little girl that as we'd begin to prepare the meal, stories about Mom would begin. She'd shed a tear here and there as she remembered. On Christmas Eve at church as soon as the candles were lit and the first bars of *Silent Night* were heard, my mom would need a tissue and wasn't ever able to sing.

When I met Terry McCarthy in the spring of 1998 one of the first stories he told me was of his mother crying every Christmas Eve for her dad. And now, all these years later, I watch him mourn his mom every Thanksgiving. I cry for my mom nearly every December 15th, on my own birthday, because she was always the first to wish me a happy day—doing silly things like calling me at 5:30 in the morning when I'd left for college just so she could beat my roommate to it.

Mourning through the fall, holidays, significant events, or any time a memory pops up is common among us mortals. The shortening of the days and chilling of the air doesn't help our sense of loss as the flowers fade, the grass turns brown, and the leaves fall off the trees. I want to let you know, siblings, I see your grief in this time where, on the first Sunday in November, we pause to remember all those who have passed before us into the Church Triumphant.

In Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians, he uses Chapter 4 to teach the community about how we now live as those connected to God through Christ. There's the usual morality stuff, pointers about loving one another, and lots of complicated Paulish language. But, there's also this gem about how we are to view death in light of Christ's coming to take us to an expected eternity in glory—as people who rely on HOPE.

Hope is difficult to grasp when we're in sorrow. We too often allow ourselves to wallow and end up instead of hoping, just wishing. What's the difference?

Wishing is the grasping onto future times without a handle to hold onto. In hopeless grief we grasp for air. Hoping is the grasping onto future times while hanging onto the handle of faith. In hopeful grief we grasp for Christ and His promises to and for us. Does hoping make grief go away? No. But, it fills even the sorrow with joy, joy in the trust that we'll be reunited with our loved ones and joy in the imagery we can see through faith of the life they're living now.

Let us, as we enter this holiday season, remember with hope those we love and live in joy at their resurrection life and the one promised to us as well. We are Easter people!







Present: Pastor Susan, Dona Lerew, Sherry Brown, Sandy Emig, Leon Leas, Bob King, Bob Aims, Susan Clauser, Joshlyn Sharrer, Karen Sheaffer, and Mark Boyer. Absent were Barb Kaufman and Michael Sheads.

Dona called the meeting to order and the agenda was reviewed. The following changes were made: 1) Added discussion on Worship & Music Survey; 2) Discussion on Endowment Holding Account.

The Secretary's Report was reviewed. Pastor Susan made a motion to approve the minutes as written, Sherry seconded, all agreed and the motion carried.

Treasurer's Report was reviewed with no major updates.

#### Ministry Reports

#### Fellowship Team (Parish Life):

The Parish Life meeting was held on Tuesday, August 27, 2024. The following items were planned -

• For the food pantry lunch on September 4th, we will serve picnic food. Zwingli will host the lunch on October 2nd and Bermudian was asked to host the lunch on either November or December.

• We will supply drinks for the combined, outdoor service on September 15th at the East Berlin community park.

• We discussed helping the fruit belt farm workers at the York Springs camp again this fall in some way. I left a voicemail for Pastor Aquilar and am waiting to hear back. We discussed taking a meal, health kits, sweatshirts, rain ponchos, and/or snack bags.

#### Finance & Endowment:

Trinity Finance Committee meeting August 21, 2024

Members present; Bob Aims, Bob King, Sue Clauser, Jay Smith, Charles Hoffman 1. After discussion of the balance of the Endowment Holding Account being \$253, the Finance Committee agreed torecommend funding an additional \$10K from the proceeds/earnings of the Endowment Fund to fund the Endowment Holding account. This request will be made first to the Endowment Committee and then to Council for approval.

2. Finance will meet at 6:30 PM September 9 to start consideration of the 2025 budget. The committee will use the same Excel report structure and process as used for the 2024 budget.

3. Bob Aims will draft a message for review by Finance for the September newsletter indicating the general financial condition of Church finances based on July numbers. The intent is to keep church members generally knowledgeable.

4. Charlie Hoffman and Bob King will continue stewardship of Trinity's investment strategies for CDs and Money Market fund renewals due in October.

5. Bob King and Jay Smith discussed the bids requested and received by Property for church building repairs, primarily masonry restoration, totaling around \$322,000. He discussed additional items (like windowsills, soffit, steeple repairs) which may likely raise the required repair amounts to about \$400,000. Finance discussed

the likelihood of a Capital Campaign to raise the needed funds. Bob Aims will research the processes involved in the last Trinity campaign for the building addition in  $\sim 2000$ .

6. Finance discussed the  $\sim$ \$17,000 grant funds request for a church security system that has been submitted.
