How can we faithfully celebrate Emmanuel (meaning = "God with us"} on one Wednesday and by the next Wednesday be turning to our own devices as we flip the calendar page?

Thus, I truly do wish and pray for you an Accompanied New Year. God has broken into the world to be with us. Let us not forget how powerfully that changes our world view as we gaze

on this creation God so loved and engage together in the work of loving that Jesus has set before us.

In our Baptismal celebrations we acknowledge one another as workers together in the Kingdom of God. Yes, we're in a broken world and many of us are broken. But the Savior who is born for us reminds us in every gospel that the Kingdom of God has come near. God is truly in it with us; we are not alone.

So, let us begin this coming new year safe in the knowledge that whatever we are called to do, we do it fully Accompanied by a God who gave up the glory of Heaven's throne to sit in the sand and cry with us, heal us, offer us grace, and move mountains with his love.




Coffee Station: Trinity's coffee station located in the narthex is available for anyone to use. In addition to coffee, there is hot chocolate and occasionally, hot cider.

Christmas at Trinity

Please join in the celebration of Christmas this season at the following services:

- Sunday, December 15th at 2:00pm— Blue Christmas Service, a daytime service recognizing that grief impacts our celebration. Followed by a light lunch.
- Sunday, December 24th at 7:00pm— Family Christmas Eve Service. This service focuses on a children's celebration of Christ's Nativity, including a parade, a childfriendly Nativity scene, reading from the children's bible, battery candles for the littlest, and Holy Communion. Kids, see Pastor Susan to volunteer for a worship leader job.
- Sunday, December 24th at 10:00pm— Traditional Christmas Eve Service. This service will feature a traditional Christmas liturgy with Holy Communion, and candlelight.



The Property Team has had a busy 2024! In addition to the normal maintenance of our property and facilities, the site work and walk-way installation of the gazebo, numerous meetings have been held to assess and develop a restoration plan for the original portion of our church building. Since constructed in 1887, and to our knowledge, there has been no full-scale maintenance or restoration work performed on the masonry or roofing on the primary structure. Three masonry restoration contractors provided estimates for masonry restoration, and we are currently awaiting estimates for the bell tower and Sanctuary roofing repairs. During these contractor site visits and closer inspection, other property improvement items have been noted and are being considered. Here's a partial summarized list of the major restoration items being considered:

• Tuckpointing of masonry on the entire original church structure including bell tower. Repair/replace damaged brick and brownstone sills

- Helical stitching of vertical cracks with stainless steel rods
- Repair or replacement of bell tower roof.
- Removal of all bell tower wood railing, enclose (4) bell tower openings with louvered coverings and install interior screens to prevent bird infiltration
- Cover all wood surfaces (inside bell tower roof) with maintenance free aluminum
- Cover all exterior bell tower wood soffit with maintenance free aluminum
- Re-surface bell tower internal metal roofing with an epoxy or rubberized coating
- Box out West and East sides of Sanctuary overhang and cover with maintenance free aluminum
- Cover North and South wood soffit surfaces with maintenance free aluminum
- Replace all wooden windowsills (19) with precast concrete sills
- Repair/replace damaged or broken slate on Sanctuary. Seat and seal any "popped" nail heads

- Determine cause of water infiltration resulting in rotting roofing substrate and propose remediation alternatives.
- Repair/replace any rotted roofing substrate on Sanctuary
- Remove/Repair/ bell tower finial (weathervane)

We hope to have estimates from the two roofing contractors by the end of November so we can determine the projected overall cost of this restoration effort. Once all this information has been received and evaluated, these details will be shared with Council and the congregation through a series of meetings and postings. Due to the magnitude and cost of this proposed restoration effort, congregational approval will be required through an official congregational meeting before any further action will be taken. 


