Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." John 6:32-35

Dear Siblings in Christ,

I've been feeding a growing boy for almost 18 years now. I've seen the kid eat a box of Hungry Jack pancakes by himself, three cans of ravioli in one sitting, four grilled cheese sandwiches, half a chicken. On our trip out west earlier this summer I packed our cooler with 18 Lunchables thinking they'd get us (all three) from Yellowstone to Glacier. We had to stop in Great Falls and buy more.

It's experiences like this, as well as my own hunger, and well...simply being human that makes me always read Jesus's promise in verse 35 above with skepticism. "Yeah right, Jesus! Me? Never hungry? My kid always satisfied? HA!" We so quickly go to doubt when it comes to the Lord's promises, especially if we've ever been in need... of food, of money, of health, of support. We know what it's like to need and it fills us with a reality that Jesus just doesn't seem to get sometimes, despite his God-with-us experience of our human life.

That's because Jesus can see over the metaphorical hill that's blocking our view. We just spent five weeks in worship reading through John's chapter 6 which starts with John's version of the Feeding of the 5,000. Twelve baskets of extra pieces were collected after Jesus broke five small barley loaves and two fish. (*Incidentally, the Sea of Galilee/Tiberius is plenteous with tilapia; you may be eating the same fish Jesus fed to people when you get them for \$1.99/lb at Giant!*) The Word he shared as he blessed that small meal and the power in his hands is not lost to the man Jesus who stands before the crowd (and us) and promises enough. He's been familiar since the

dawn of time with the creative power of the Father to provide a planet with enough for all. In fact, that very same ability fills Jesus! Remember the water into wine? The stilling of the sea? The woman who was cured simply because she touched his cloak? Or when he cured the soldier's servant without even being there?

From Christ's perspective, there is nothing that is impossible and no need that cannot be met. So, why is it so hard to trust him? That's what he's saying! Jesus wants to know, especially given what the disciples (not just the 12) have seen and heard, why they don't lean in instead of wandering off, still looking to be fed. Jesus repeats himself over and over, telling us in this chapter that HE IS THE BREAD OF LIFE so that his audience might FINALLY understand that God is with them—for reals.

When Jesus gave us his body and blood, on the cross and in the communion bread and wine, he shares himself fully with us—for reals. You touch the power of Christ and hear his Word each time you receive the sacrament. That miracle we read in scripture is being lived every time we break bread together, with Jesus's true presence in, with and among us. And from that table, our regular meals are an extension of all that is holy when we give thanks to God for provision and share with one another and the world what the Lord has sent to us.

Many thanks to all of you for joining me in our walk through John's Chapter 6, for the devotion to Christ that we share, for the bread you brought and the bread you shared. We only read the "Bread of Life" stuff every three years in our regular worship lectionary, but that gift of sustaining life is always with us.

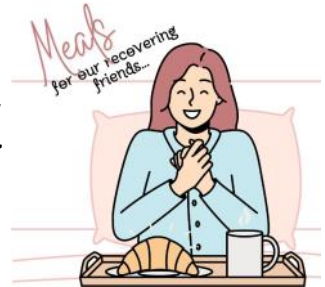
WELCA News
