CAPTIAL CAMPAIGN/BUILDING FUND UPDATE: AUGUST 2023

We began this fund drive on April 9th, 2023. It's amazing to see and witness the commitment and devotion to God's church through this body of believers. Our brother and sister churches of the NALC have responded to our call for help by sharing a benevolence gift to Epiphany. I received a call from Christ Lutheran Church in Pennsylvania informing me that their church closed at the end of 2022. Their congregation is donating material goods that will help save us purchasing these items. This donation from Christ Lutheran has \$7,000.00 value in material for worship that can be used in the transition building.

The NALC grant application was completed, and we received a call from Pr. Brad Hales that our grant application for \$12,000.00 was approved and we should receive the funds in August. These funds will be used to establish bathroom facilities on the property that will attach to the transition building.

Trinity Lutheran Church in Ashland, Ohio has an outreach fund that receives fund requests once a year. I submitted our application for their outreach fund grant for the transition building electronic equipment and media needs. Please add this grant application to your prayer list for Epiphany.

I would like to thank our brothers and sisters of the NALC for their financial donation in response to the letter they received from Epiphany. We are delighted with the response from across The United States and pray that we continue to experience generous financial help from our brother and sister churches.



First time users will have to create and verify an account. This will take a couple of days to verify you are the account holder. A small deposit (cents) will need to be deposited to the account to complete the verification. Once verified, simply login using the credentials used to create the account.

Once logged in, you may enter the amount you wish to donate, in the next box there will be a pull down arrow which will allow you to select "Memorial Fund Offerings", the default is "2023 General Offerings", simply click on the arrow and select "Memorial Fund Offerings". Choose a Payment Source, either the bank account used to create the account or another source such as a credit card, you'll be prompted through the process. Please note in the memo area the name of the person the donation is in memory of.
