On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! The summer months are coming quickly, and we are preparing for vacations and family arrivals. We celebrate a new life and we reflect on the journey we experienced during lent. To finally, celebrate Resurrection Day. The church doesn't celebrate with bunnies and eggs. We celebrate Resurrection Day with the Risen Lord. We have faith in the resurrection, and we believe the witnesses in God's Word. How many Easters have you celebrated in your life? The symbol of our Christian faith will tower over God's church Epiphany as we begin searching for the new location.

The church is growing and God is sending gifted disciples to the congregation weekly. We can find hope in God's plan just as we found life in the empty tomb. Our congregation life is filled with the Holy Spirit and we have grown to celebrate with the same Spirit that Jesus breathed into his disciples.

While I write this newsletter, we are finalizing the ending of our legal battle with St. Paul and the FB Synod of the ELCA. We have reached a settlement together and we are no longer tied to legal proceedings. So, we celebrate many things this spring and we look toward the vision God has set before us as well as the challenges we face in serving "all" of God's people.

Below you will see that the ELCA is taking action on the resolution passed during the 2019 National Assembly. The resolution on Faith, Sexism, and Justice which changes the liturgy, bible, and the meaning of the Trinity will be reviewed and enforced. These changes within the Word of God are why you voted to leave the ELCA.

If you recall from our vote to leave the ELCA, the representative of the ELCA/FB Synod stated that they would not be enforcing the resolution. We knew that they would make this change because line 1747 in the document calls for "accountability" in 2021. Covid-19 slowed their process but they are going to implement the accountability upon all the congregations in the ELCA.

ELCA Church Council Considers Debt, Discipline and a Declaration to the Muslim Community

ITASCA, III. (April 6, 2022) —The Church Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) met March 31–April 2. The council, which serves as the ELCA's board of directors, took action on a variety of matters before this church.

The council took the following key actions:

- Adopted "A Declaration of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to the Muslim Community" as a statement on Lutheran-Muslim relations.
- Authorized the formation of an ad hoc committee as identified in the implementing
 resolutions for the social statement Faith, Sexism and Justice: A Call to Action, adopted by
 the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, and assigned the committee with guiding a process
 for public repentance, including a churchwide day of confession and repentance for the sins
 of patriarchy and sexism.



<u>Manna Food Bank</u> – Mission Sunday was April 10 2022. Gerry delivered 146 lbs of food donations. Gerry will be calling the volunteers to remind them to have their cars parked by the entrance on the right side of the Synagogue, by 8:00am, on their volunteered day.

<u>Books for Prisoners -</u> Gerry delivered 25 books to the "Open Book" book store on Guillemard St. Epiphany Lutheran Church will now take donations of paperback books.

<u>Pull Tab Collections</u> – This is a joint venture between the Synagogue and Epiphany Lutheran. We are responsible for delivering the tabs when the box is full. The Ronald McDonald House uses the money from the tabs to pay their utilities. The latest count was almost 1 pound (14.2 oz.) which is about 1001 tabs.

<u>Donation of the Lenten coin offerings</u> – A portion of our Lenten offerings will be donated to **Proud Moments**, **ABA** (**Applied Behavior Analysis**,) a local center for kids with Autism and mental illness. They have 3 locations in the area: one on Creighton, Hwy 98, and Davis Hwy. They do not accept cash donations, but are very excited that we will be donating needed items that will be purchased with the offerings. Regina went by and provided some business cards and put her contact # and email on the back.

Another portion of our **Lenten coin offerings, along with Thrivent grants,** will be going to **Camp Happy**<u>Sands</u> – Joyce at Camp Happy Sands, says they are excited to be back open this year, but only for 4 weeks in June. The **Social Ministry Committee chose June 14, 2022 as Epiphany Lutheran Church's volunteer day.** Deacon Glenn will be applying for a Thrivent grant for the food, so we can donate half the coin offerings to the school supply and wish list. We will be delivering lunch to the camp on that day as well as the supplies.

We will be taking donations for Camp Happy Sands towards the end of May. There will be a sign.

Members of Epiphany Lutheran Church can bring their clothing donations the Sundays prior to the Saturdays listed. Those dates will be as follows: June 5, 2022, September 11, 2022 and December 4, 2022. Please place the garments on the last pew.

A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER

Qualified Charitable Distributions from your IRA

Have you recently finished filing your income taxes? Were you able to claim Itemized Deductions or did you Claim the Standard Deduction? When the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act was implemented a few years back, it greatly increased the Standard Deduction, meaning that most people will no longer benefit from itemized deductions. Itemized deductions include medical expenses (over a certain threshold), real estate taxes paid (up to a limit), mortgage interest paid, and charitable contributions. If you are now claiming a Standard Deduction, you are no longer benefiting (for income tax purposes only) from your charitable contributions... but what if there was a way that you could?

Do you have an IRA that you are taking "Required Minimum Distributions" from? If yes, you could receive a tax benefit for making "Qualified Charitable Distributions", or QCDs. A QCD is where you tell the custodian of your IRA to send a portion of your RMD to a qualified public charity. The custodian sends this amount directly to the charity and you can exclude that amount from your taxable IRA distributions on your tax return for the year. This only works for IRA distributions – not pensions, not 401(k) plans. Your IRA custodian should have paperwork for you to complete should you choose to make QCDs. If you have general questions, Vanessa is happy to talk to you (after tax filing season is over).
